The session was well attended by 27 people and ran from 5:30pm, concluding at 9:00pm. Those in attendance were able to raise concerns and ask questions regarding the project and we thank all those attendees for openly providing their views.

This meeting has given us further opportunities to consider how our project can either avoid, mitigate or offset these concerns through further changes to the current project.

Many of the community extended the invitation to Williamtown Sand to explain in more detail the proposal through one-on-one meetings and to inspect and witness their concerns at their properties or onsite.
